### 1. Examination Structure and Requirements

The TNUSRB Sub-Inspector (Taluk, AR, TSP) selection process involves a two-part written examination designed to assess both linguistic competence and core academic knowledge.

#### 1.1. Written Examination Pattern

- **Part II Marking:** Each question carries **0.5 marks**.
  - General Knowledge: 80 Questions (40 Marks)
  - Psychology & Aptitude: 60 Questions (30 Marks)

### 2. Part I: Tamil Eligibility Test (Qualifying)

This section tests proficiency up to the 10th standard level. Attaining the minimum qualifying score (40 marks) is mandatory.

A strategic approach is crucial for optimizing preparation time and maximizing scores in both parts of the TNUSRB SI exam.

5.1. Strategy for Part I: Tamil Eligibility Test

Although qualifying, neglecting Part I can be disastrous. The strategy should focus on mandatory minimum achievement (40 marks).

- **Grammar Focus:** Allocate 60% of your Tamil study time to *Ilakknam* (Grammar). Topics like *Pirithu/Serthu Ezhuthuga*, Synonyms, and Antonyms are rule-based and high-scoring.
- **Thirukkural Mastery:** Memorize the first few couplets and key themes. Questions on *Thirukkural* are mandatory and often direct.
- **Source Material:** Rely exclusively on the Tamil textbooks from 6th to 10th standard Samacheer Kalvi for both Grammar and Literature sections.

### 5.2. Strategy for Part II: Main Written Exam

This section determines the rank and selection. The focus must be on maximizing the 70 marks available.

#### 5.2.1. Mastering Psychology & Aptitude (60 Questions/30 Marks)

This is the highest-yielding section per unit of time and effort.

- **Daily Practice:** Dedicate 1.5 - 2 hours daily to practice. Consistency is more important than long, infrequent sessions.
- **Focus on Speed:** Use a timer for every practice set. For 60 questions in 150 minutes (Main Exam), you have roughly 2.5 minutes per question overall, but Aptitude requires quicker solving. Aim to solve these 60 questions in under 60-70 minutes during the exam.
- **Syllogism and Direction Sense:** These topics are critical and require structured, rule-based practice.

#### 5.2.2. Optimizing General Knowledge (80 Questions/40 Marks)

- **Tamil Nadu Specifics:** Prioritize subjects with a high weightage of Tamil Nadu content: South Indian History (Cholas, Pallavas), TN Geography (Rivers, Crops, Dams), and TN Economy/Welfare Schemes. These topics are easy to score if covered thoroughly from the Samacheer books.

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- **Polity:** Focus on core articles (e.g., Fundamental Rights, DPSP), major amendments, and the structure of the Parliament/Judiciary. Conceptual clarity over rote memorization of every article.
- **Current Affairs Integration:** Connect Current Affairs with static GK. For example, if a river project is in the news, revise the geography of that river/dam.

### 5.3. Revision and Testing Protocol

Phase	Duration	Activity	Goal
I	6 Weeks	Subject Study & Note Taking	Complete first reading and create topic-wise short notes.
II	3 Weeks	Thematic Revision & Part I Tests	Revise notes; attempt weekly Part I (Tamil) Mock Tests.
III	3 Weeks	Full Mock Tests & Analysis	Attempt <b>2 Full Mock Tests per week</b> (Part I & II). Error analysis is mandatory.

**Crucial Note:** Never skip the mock test analysis. Review every incorrect and unattempted question to identify the root cause (Knowledge gap or Silly mistake).

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
